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Air Quality Index Chart

The Air Quality Index (AQI) reports ozone, particulate matter and other common pollutants. **The higher the rating, the greater the danger.**

Good

AQI Index: 0-50

Air quality is considered satisfactory, and air pollution poses little or no risk.

Moderate

AQI Index: 51-100

Air quality is acceptable; however, for some pollutants there may be a moderate health concern for a very small number of people who are unusually sensitive to air pollution.

Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups

AQI Index: 101-150

Members of sensitive groups* may experience health effects. The general public is not likely to be affected.

* Sensitive groups include active adults, people with heart or lung disease (including asthma), older adults and children.

Unhealthy

AQI Index: 151-200

Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious health effects.

Very Unhealthy

AQI Index: 201-300

Everyone may experience more serious health effects.

Hazardous

AQI Index: 301+

Emergency conditions. The entire population is more than likely to be affected.
